**Introduction:** The message about prosperity has been greatly attacked over the years because many people have been deceived by the enemy. True prosperity is not just about money. What good is it for us to prosper in our bank accounts and not in our health, relationships, marriages, and in our families. True prosperity is being successful in every arena of our lives; in my spirit, my soul, my body, in my relationships and in my finances. You may ask, “So why does God want us to have true prosperity?” He wants to show the world that there is profit in serving Him. When we prosper, we can help and serve others. When the church prospers, we are empowered to further the Gospel message around the world.

**SUBJECT: PROSPERING WITH A CHRIST MINDSET IN FINANCES-Pt.2.**

Financial prosperity is the divine right of every Christian. In fact it’s more than a divine right, it’s a divine obligation. Yet many Christians are neither enjoying their rights nor fulfilling their obligation. However, it is time to become that believer, who has put aside the mistaken idea that financial prosperity is ungodly and discover the truth that has transformed their poverty into abundance.

**Steps in Understanding Financial Prosperity with a Christ Mindset**

- 1.** Allow the teachings of Jesus Christ to clean your mind of a poverty mindset.  
**See John 15:3.** A Poverty-mindset is a part of the curse, and a curse is the opposite of the blessing. A curse is an empowerment to fail than to prosper. Poverty means that there is something deficient, insufficient and lacking; and it means having little or no money, resources or support. **See Deuteronomy 28:15-68.** Jesus did not teach this, neither is it OK! **See Galatians 3:13.**
  - A.** Jesus was not poor
    1. He had a house
    2. He had a treasury
    3. He wore expensive clothing
  - B.** Jesus recruited wealthy professional business people as his disciples.  
Why? Because a poor person has no influence. **See Ecclesiastes 9:13-16.**
    - 1.** Commercial Fishermen. **See Mark 1:16-20.**
    - 2.** Professional Tax Collectors. **See Luke 5:28-32.**

Statements Jesus made about Himself regarding wealth.

1. The promise of wealth to his true followers. **See Mark 10:17-30.**
2. Jesus gives us abundant life as the Good Shepherd. **See John 10:10-11.**
3. Jesus gives us advice as to what is true wealth. **See Revelation 3:14-19.**
